One corner of the skating rink was dedicated to the Normandy Campaign and the 80th Anniversary of D-Day. Sergeant Charles Dorscheid & Private Donald Rooney were both KIA during the push towards Caen & closing the Falaise Pocket (red background). Private William Adams has a blue background and he served with the 1st Canadian Parachute Battalion and landed behind enemy lines late on the night of June 5th or early morning on the 6th to clear the area of enemy snipers. The fellow with the yellow highlighted area is Lance Corporal David Burrows who landed on Juno beach



on June 6th, 1944. The pictures below the heroes are photos & information of the area known as "Operation Overlord" as it exists now. On the tables were pictures of Canadians on D-Day and during the Battle of Normandy.

Special guests included the South Korean Consul General Yuen and Consul of Veterans Affairs Kim, along with high-ranking members of the Canadian Armed Forces, the Military Police and various dignitaries including representation from all levels of government.
